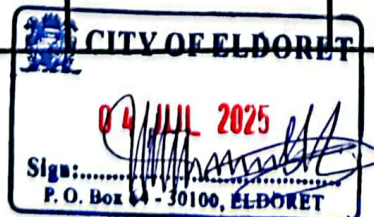

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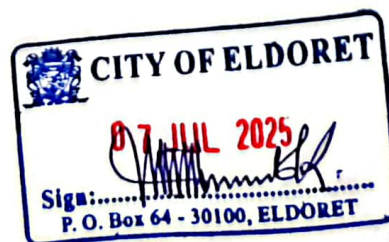

### **MIN COECF01/08/2025: PRELIMINARIES**

The meeting officially started at 9.40 AM with a word of prayer from Mr. Kipchumba Barno.

The chairman then welcomed members and thanked them for attending the meeting and for keeping time.

The minutes of the meeting held on 9<sup>th</sup> May 2025 were read and adopted.

### **MIN EMCF02/08/2025: ARBORETUM**

Mr. Ian Kipchoge thanked the management for the excellent initiative in establishing the botanical garden. He pleaded with the responsible department to ensure that maintenance is upheld to the highest standards. He asked that grass should be cleared from the cabro pathways, grass be mowed regularly and to enhance the overall beauty of the place.

He however complained about high fees charged that discourage people from visiting the arboretum. He proposed that entrance fees be reduced citing the fees charged earlier as too expensive. He also requested that the management should work on detaching it from Kenya Forest service.

### **MIN COECF03/08/2025: SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT**

Mr. Meshack Amai talked about waste management and the importance of proper waste management. He said business owners need to be responsible at their business premises and that lack of proper solid waste collection and disposal by business owners at the CBD was alarming in the recent weeks. Business owners irresponsibly send street urchins to dispose waste and they dump the solid waste at solitary places especially at the drainage between Naivas Trocadero and Khetias supermarkets.

Ms. Wilson Limo promised on behalf of the traders to be more responsible going forward. He urged the city management to talk to private waste collectors who were not taking their responsibilities seriously.

Mr. Elvis Towet aired his concern that he has noted that the use of polythene bags was getting on the rise despite the government ban in the same way, plastic waste was also on the rise. He urged

for strict enforcement of environment safety laws which prohibit the use of polythene bags and burning of all kinds of waste.

#### **MIN COECF04/08/2025: CLIMATE CHANGE**

Mr. Gideon Kirwa, an environment officer took the participants through a session on climate change and how it contributes to extreme weather events that lead to health risks, food security issues and increased displacement of people. He urged the participants to be ambassadors of restoring the climate by engaging in activities such as tree planting and transitioning to renewable energy.

Mr. Wilson Kones supported his remarks and raised a concern about flooding in the city especially between Naivas supermarket(Trocadero) and Family care Hospital where when it rains, floods make the road from MTRH impassable disrupting normal activities. This has become a big menace tracing back to climate change.

Members requested the city administration to improve drainage systems in the city as they find a lasting solution for this problem.

#### **MIN COECF05/08/2025: MAINTENANCE OF NON MOTORIZED WALK WAYS**

Mr. Henry Thuo talked about the misuse of non-motorized tracks within the city. He urged the city management to maintain the damaged lanes and enforce the laws barring heavy tracks, light vehicles and even motor bikes from using the same lanes.

#### **MIN COECF06/08/2025: SECURITY**

Ms. Trevor Kibet, a small business owner running a movie shop, decried nighttime raids that take place in the shop on the right hand side as you head to Kokwas estate(at the sharp corner near UG high). He urged the city management to intervene to prevent further loss of property.

He requested the management to install security lights as they seek a lasting solution for this problem.

**MIN COECF07/08/2025: ADJOURNMENT OF THE MEETING**

There being no other business, the meeting was officially adjourned at 3.30 PM with a word of prayer from Ms. Jane Lagat. The next meeting will be held on 19<sup>th</sup> December 2025 at the same venue and time.

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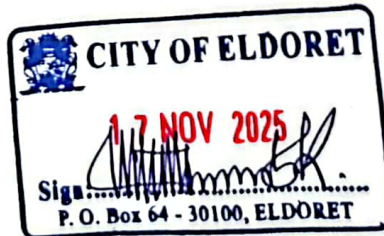

### **MIN COECF01/12/2025: PRELIMINARIES**

The chairman called the meeting to order and thanked members for attending the meeting and for keeping time. An opening prayer was offered by Mr. Elvis Too. The chairman welcomed the secretary to read the minutes of the previous meeting. It was resolved that the minutes of citizens forum held on 7th August 2025 be noted and confirmed as the true record of the proceedings.

### **MIN COECF02/12/2025: STREET LIGHT & MANAGEMENT**

Mr. Fredrick Serem took the participants through a session of sensitization on the street lights and its importance for the city. He asked the participants to share their thoughts on the same.

Ms. Kezziah Nduta thanked the responsible department for the smart move. She urged the city management to replace all the damaged street lights in order to improve security within the city.

Mr. Alex Kipkemei proposed that welcome lights should be installed in the city to further enhance security and transform the city's image. He noted that there was need for people to be educated/sensitized because challenges with use of traffic lights were evident especially the boda boda riders who do not adhere to the rules hence causing accidents. He also proposed that more solar powered flood lights and street lights were needed within the CBD and busy neighborhoods.

### **MIN COECF03/12/2025: SEWAGE**

Mr. Eric Sawe, a cobbler at the bridge near Trocadero, complained about sewage water that's frequently discharged to the drainage system causing pollution and forcing them to flee their working area until the bad smell subsides. He asked the management to pick up the matter and find a permanent solution for the menace.

### **MIN COECF04/12/2025: DRUG ABUSE**

Ms. Cynthia Barno raised a concern about the high prevalence of drug abuse among the youth, specifically those who are frustrated about unemployment and college students was alarming. Among the drugs used include alcohol consumption, cannabis, heroin and inhalants like shisha. She pleaded with the management to run campaigns to sensitize the youth on the effects these drugs cause in their bodies.

Mr. Moses Rutto said they have intensified enforcement aimed at illegal alcohol, shisha joints, and drug dens. This will help arrest the problem as we engage with other stakeholders to find a long term solution.

**MIN COECF05/12/2025: HAWKERS**

Mr. Davies Tanui, a business man in the city requested the management to protect businesses that are operating legally by paying for licences and have rent to pay from hawkers who sell their goods at extremely low prices, leaving them with no customers. He said this problem is even worse towards Christmas and they need the authorities to act in favor business owners.

**MIN COECF06/12/2025: AFFORDABLE HOUSING**

Mr. James Rotich, a ward administrator, talked to the participants in the meeting about the affordable housing project by the national government. He asked them to seize the opportunity of owning a house in the city by securing themselves a unit in the Affordable housing projects. He emphasised that this is a great chance that every serious person ought to make use of.
